- 2006 New orientation in collaboration with the Wolfsberg Konferenzzentrum, Ermatingen. Urs Bircher takes over management of the Seepark with the task of shaping a successful future
- 1998 Through the SBV and SBG merge, Hotel «Seepark» becomes a subsidiary of the UBS AG
- 1989 Official celebration and opening of the «Seepark» training centre – with federal councillor Flavio Cotti as guest
- 1987 The foundation stone is laid
- 1977 First visit to the Villa Selve in Thun by SBV representatives
- 1906 The honourable councillor of commerce, Gustav Selve, owner of the Schweizerische Metallwerke Selve & Co. metal works plans on purchasing a property such as the Schadau or Chartreuse by Lake Thun
